

# Building Nope CELEBRATE RECOVERY

God is faithful, and we too, seek to be faithful in all that he has called us to build through Celebrate Recovery. This may look like a large gathering at Kollen Park, or meals on Monday nights, but it also may look like a small circle of three or four men or women who gather in a local sober living home for bible study and prayer, or a group of ten meeting at the jail for a weekly recovery meeting. Every life matters and every person is created in HIS image with a purpose and deeply loved by him.

In 2024 we introduced weekly free meals. This was a huge step of faith for us, but GOD has continued to provide in wonderful ways. This has been a blessing for our community and a great way for individuals and families to connect.

"I started attending Central in February when I moved here from the Chicagoland area. Prior to that, I had been watching online. I originally started attending Central because I heard you had an amazing Celebrate Recovery Ministry and that was important for me when looking for a church. I believe every church should have a Celebrate Recovery Ministry!!!

I originally got sober in AA, but it wasn't until I started attending CR at my church in Chicago that I truly began to understand the overwhelming and unconditional love and grace of Jesus Christ. AA is where I learned to live life without drinking and where I

learned that there was a spiritual solution to my problem. CR is where I learned about Jesus, and where I learned about all the underlying issues that caused me to drink and act out in other ways. I love that I was able to continue my recovery journey surrounded by like-minded Christians who showed me an example of what it was to be Jesus. Today, CR is not only where I continue growing and recovering from my hurts, habits and hangups, but also where God is using my story to help others. There is no greater joy than being used to do God's work and CR is a safe place to serve, learn and grow."

needing help/supervision. For an hour and a half the grandmothers were able to sit and relax and visit with their group while the helpers saw to the needs of the children. # This summer, 31 middle school students and 12 leaders

partnered alongside People Helping People to serve the community of Pullman, MI. Our team ran a VBS program for 60 children in the community, prepared and served them lunch everyday, and also completed a variety of work projects including painting, landscaping, yard cleanups, and chopping wood for their firewood ministry (many of the residents in Pullman use small wood stoves to heat their homes in the winter months). Our team was given a renewed perspective on our many blessings and was propelled forward to continue this missional mindset close to home. Perhaps the greatest benefit of this experience lies in the opportunity to continue to serve alongside People Helping People year-round with their location being so close to home!

Leading up to and coming out of our time in Pullman, students have been given opportunities to come alongside the senior community at Resthaven Maple Woods in Holland. We've had the tremendous privilege of lending an extra hand during events offered to their residents, including car shows, cardio drumming, picnics, birthday parties, along with simply spending time with residents while playing games and walking with them. While we hope to have helped the Resthaven team and helped their residents feel seen and valued, it's also been great for our students to be involved in a community that is entering into the last stages of life. Their community has been a tremendous blessing to us and has taught us to be thankful for each day God gives us. The team and their residents have also voiced how thankful they are to have such young faces and energy in their space on a consistent basis!



# THE SESTIS YET ONCE

# THE CALL TO GIVE
