Discussion Questions

- 1). Throughout the series, we have said "Jesus isn't just the answer -- He sparks the questions that lead us to the truth." For example, the story of Jesus & Nicodemus, found in John 3, exemplifies a hot question ("How can this be?") followed by Jesus asking "You are Israel's teacher, and you do not understand these things?" In this, we see that Jesus (the Truth, the Word made flesh) sparks us to deeper thinking by asking questions of us. How does this affect us? Raise doubt? Increase faith? Clarity or confusion? What is Jesus really trying to get us to do?
- 2). Do we fear questions/doubt, and why?
- 3). What are some takeaways from the Hot Ones series that we need to remember and keep applying in our mission to amplify the hope and life of Jesus?
- 4). Looking back at the topics covered in Hot Ones, which most helpful? Which was most challenging? What else could be talked about?
- 5). We must remember that loving Jesus is the goal, not having the right answers. However, how and what we believe is vital. What's the balance between orthodoxy (correct belief) and orthopraxy (correct practice), especially when it comes to hot topics bumping into the biblical command to love God, love others (Matthew 22:37-40)?
