BOTTOM LINE | Because Jesus defeated the one who holds the power of death, I can live prepared, at peace and fully present.

KEY VERSES | Hebrews 2:14-15; 9:27-28; 11:18-22 1 John 3:1-8; 1 Corinthians 15:54-56

Psalms 16:8-10; Acts 13:35-27

1 Thessalonians 4:13; Philippians 1:21-22

- 1. What was your major takeaway from today's message?
- 2. Read 1 John 3:1-8. What lessons do we learn about the coming of Jesus in relation to the power of sin and the fear of death?
- 3. Pastor Craig said that the "enemy's power is subject to Christ's authority."
  Can you think of a time when Christ's authority helped you overcome something holding you?
- 4. How could the idea that death is not something that happens at our passing but at the moment of our arrival (see Heb. 9:27-28) help someone battle the fear of dying?
- 5. How should a Christian "prepare" for death? What does this look like practically? What implication does such preparedness have on the way we live out of faith?
- 6. Do you know someone who was unprepared for death? Do you know someone who was prepared for death? What were the hallmarks of such lives that stick out to you?
- 7. A godly analogy for death is birth because birth must feel like death to a child who is thrust out of the comfortable and into the unknown. How helpful is this analogy to you as you think about facing your mortality in peace?
- 8. Look at John 11:35 and 1 Thessalonians 4:13. What do these passages teach us about grief?
