1. What was your biggest takeaway from the teaching?
2. How has your learning of the contexts of each of these letters thus far enhanced your understanding of how intentional Jesus was in what he said to the churches?
3. Brad suggested that the greatest threat to the American Church today is biblical illiteracy, because when you don't know what's in God's Word, you outsource truth for others to define, and therefore it's easy to compromise because culture's arguments can be very persuasive. Do you agree or disagree with this? And why?
4. Where do you feel the most tension or pressure to accommodate to culture?
5. Confession is acknowledging that you're off the path. Repentance is the comprehensive work of returning to the path. Was this differentiation between "Confession" and "Repentance" from the teaching helpful to you? Why or why not?
6. Jesus's only imperative (command) in this letter was to "repent." Where do you feel you've gotten of the path and need to return?
7. How will you begin living out the truths of the teaching this week?
