Psalm 115:3 • Romans 6:22 • Galatians 5:1-15

We have exchanged bondage to sin with being bonded to God through Christ.

- 1. A core issue in freedom is authority. How does your authority practically influence others' freedom? When have you used that authority in a direct and authoritative way? What motivated it?
- 2. How does God's authority over your life express itself in the way you do live and make decisions? When is it tempting to leave God out of your decisions?
- 3. Biblical freedom is not biblical when it ignores the needs of the weak and the vulnerable. Can you think of any circumstances were that principal does not apply?
- 4. No one becomes biblically free unless they accept the need to be set free from sin. Read Romans 6:22. What does biblical Freedom look like on the basis of this verse?
- 5. When we accepted Christ we exchanged bondage to sin with being bonded to God. Looking at your life, how have you experienced freedom from the controlling power of sin?
- 6. My freedom is constrained by the fact that I am not free to pursue everything I desire. Do you agree with this statement? Why or why not?
- 7. My freedom is constrained by the fact that I am not free to do anything that injures you. In what ways has the behavior of others who have exercised their freedom hurt you?
- 8. Pastor Craig told the story of his pet dog who ran from the house and bit a friend. Can you think of an example were freedom pursued without thinking of others results in injury?
